I, Thomas Tattersall, 4817 36th Street, NW, Washington 8, D.C., make the following voluntary statement to William H. L. Sullivan and Milton Mileski, who have identified themselves to me as Special Agents of the U.S. Information Agency. No threats or promises have been made to me and I make these remarks of my own free will.

During the course of an interview conducted by investigators of the Civil Service Commission on April 8, 1955, I was shown the picture of a young dark-haired man that I identified as being a homosexual. Subsequent to that I was interviewed on April 11 by Special Agent Mileski of the U.S. Information Agency and investigators of the Civil Service Commission in a car at the rear of the Hot Shoppes on Connecticut Avenue, at which time pictures were again shown to me and I identified again a similar picture of this dark-haired man as a homosexual.

On April 12 Special Agents Mileski and Sullivan interviewed me at the Olney Inn, at which time this picture was again shown to me. By recollection I recalled that this young man had attended concerts at Dumbarton Oaks, at the National Gallery of Arts, the Library of Congress, the Corcoran Gallery where I saw him. While I am not sure, I believe the first time I ever spoke to him was at Martin's, a bar and restaurant on Wisconsin Avenue in Georgetown. This was probably in November or December 1954. On one of these meetings I went by auto with this man to a home in Georgetown where we engaged in homosexual acts. I do not care to identify the owner of the house for personal reasons.

I do not know whether the car was owned by the young man, or the identity of it.

Before I parted at this Georgetown house, I made arrangements with the young man to meet him at the Raleigh Hotel. To the best of my knowledge this was in the early part of January 1955. I took the room by my name. This young man came to the room where we had homosexual relations.

The young man knows my first name and I know that he would recognize me if he saw me. I know he is interested in music and enjoys both jazz and classical, which is evidenced by my knowledge of his attendance at concerts and his interest in the local art galleries. He is a well dressed, well mannered young man who speaks with a clipped accent, which I believe resembles an English accent.

This young man I have seen on the streets of Washington, speaking with other males that I feel are homosexuals.

During the inspection of the picture, I had occasion to notice the name of the young man, and I now know his last name is Richards. I do not know his address or any of his family history or his employment, though I believe now that he works for the U.S. Information Agency.

I have read the above and it is true to the best of my knowledge. I have initialed the transcription and addition above 11509-7

On April 12 Special Agents Mileski and Sullivan interviewed me at the Olney Inn, at which time this picture was again shown to me. By recollection I recalled that this man was in attendance at a lecture given at the Library of Congress celebrating the Walt Whitman Centennial. This was in February or March of 1955. He was in the presence of a mixed group whose identity I do not know.

This man I met in December of 1954 at the cocktail lounge of the Roger Smith Hotel. I do not know the name of the cocktail lounge but it is the one where they have music and there is an entrance from Pennsylvania Avenue. I was sitting alone at a table. This man was also sitting alone, but close enough to me that we did enter into a conversation. I recognized in him and from some of his remarks that he was possibly a homosexual. Later, perhaps the beginning of January of 1955, I was leaving the Army and Navy Club at 17th and I Streets when I again met this man. He was alone and so was I. We went to Farragut Park and sat down. I do not recall exactly what he was wearing but I believe he had on a gray suit and topcoat. We discussed many things, particularly topics involving events in Washington, D.C., of a political and governmental nature. During this time he put his hand on my leg, which was the extent of the acts committed by him.

At a later date, but still in January 1955, I was in the Peoples Drug Store on the north side of Pennsylvania Avenue between 11th and 12th Street. On the evening in question I had taken a room at the Rawleigh Hotel and registered in my own name. When I met this man, I invited him to my room where he stayed for 2 or 3 hours and we engaged in homosexual acts.

This man knows me by the name of Tom and I am sure he would recognize me from appearance and I am sure I would recognize him. I do not know where he is employed, nor do I know the position he holds. I do not know anything of his personal history.

The picture of this individual bears a notation on the back to identify it of #001.

I have read the above and it is true to the best of my knowledge. I have initialed the correct and addition above.
